STOP SIGNS

Town of Worcester

An Ordinance establishing stop signs and other traffic control devices.

ARTICLE 1. Authority. This ordinance is adopted under authority granted in 23 V.S.A. § 1008, 24 V.S.A. § 229(4) and 24 V.S.A. Chapter 59.

ARTICLE 2. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate traffic in order to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

ARTICLE 3. DEFINITIONS. For purposes of this ordinance, the following words and/or phrases shall be defined as follows:

- a. Stop sign: The signs described in MUTCD, section 2B-4.
- b. Highway and town highway: As defined in 19 V.S.A. § 1 (12) & (21).
- c. Intersection: Any point at which a highway joins another at an angle, whether or not it crosses the other.
- d. MUTCD: The Manual for Uniform Traffic Control Devices issued by the Federal Highway Administration.

ARTICLE 4. LOCATION OF STOP SIGNS. Stop signs shall be erected on the following highways for the regulation of traffic at the following intersections:

- a. Minister Brook Road Eastbound at the intersection with Route 12
- b. Calais Road Westbound at the intersection with Route 12
- c. Gould Hill, Pratt Road and Collar Hill at the intersection with Calais Road
- d. West Hill at the intersection with Minister Brook Road
- e. Ledge Road, Downs Road, Mill Road and Hancock Brook Road at the intersection with Route 12

ARTICLE 6. PENALTIES. All penalties shall be those established by the State of Vermont for traffic violations.

ARTICLE 7. ENFORCEMENT. This ordinance may be enforced by any properly qualified Vermont law enforcement officer.

ARTICLE 8. SEVERABILITY. If any section of this ordinance is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such finding shall not invalidate any other part of this ordinance.

ARTICLE 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective 60 days after its adoption by the Worcester Selectboard. If a petition is filed under 24 V.S.A. § 1973, that statute shall govern the taking effect of this ordinance.
